Why does God start distinguishing between the "land of Goshen" and the rest of Egypt (8:21-23; 9:4, 6, 26; 10:23; 11:7)? What is He trying to get across to Pharaoh? To the Israelites? Was God or Pharaoh responsible for Pharaoh's hardened heart (4:21; 7:3, 13, 19, 32; 9:7, 12, 34-35; 10:1, 20, 25)? Do you think this is unfair? How did God use Pharaoh's hard heart? How did Israel respond when they saw Yahweh save them? (See Exodus 15.) How did Moses' father-in-law Jethro respond when he heard how Yahweh saved Israel? (See Ex 18:7-11.) In Mark 11:1-25, how does Jesus force the issue that He is Yahweh? How do the people respond to Jesus when He enters Jerusalem (Mk 11:9-10)? How do the religious leaders respond (Mt 21:15-17; Lk 19:39-40)?
